### Supplies

Hook: 2.25mm  
Yarn: Loops & Threads or  
Cotton Fair or  
Hobbii's Rainbow 8/4

Googly eyes

### Stitches

ch = chain  
sc = single crochet  
hdc = half double crochet  
dc = double crochet  
inc = increase  
dec = decrease  
slst = slip stitch  
sp = space  
ss = same space  
blo = back loop only  
flo = front loop only  
fo = fasten off

## READ THIS!!!

### NOTE:

Little known crochet shorthand fact.

sc 3 means make 1 single crochet in the next 3 spaces.

3 sc means 3 single crochet in the Same Space.

inc x 3 means inc in the next 3 spaces.

Make a mental note - this comes up.

If you like to "sew as you go", you can make the arms, legs ... and possibly the tongue first and then sew in as you go.

I don't do that well, so I don't have any tips for sew as you go. Sorry.

**dec** means you can use any kind of decrease you feel comfortable with. Visible, Invisible, Partially visible, Naked. Whatever!

**mc** means - patterns may use a Magic Circle, Magic Ring, Magic Loop, Ch 2 method or Ch 4 and make a ring.

I don't care which you use. Just make a hole and commit to it.

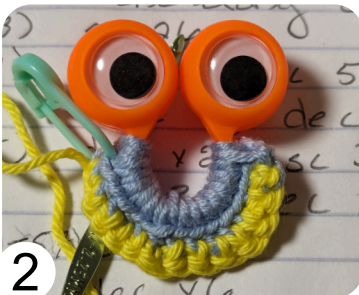
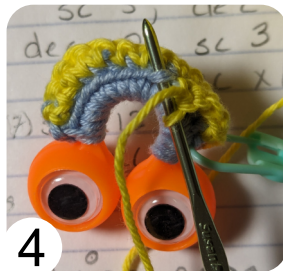
# Round 2 Explained

## Round 2 Explained 3 Times!

Explanation 1: This is where it gets Twitchy - you do 13 sc in the flo only BUT THEN you will turn the project and go back over those same stitches and do sc 13 in the blo. Basically you're going to do a circle.

Explanation 2: Still confused? Technically, since you do flo sc 13 and then turn, you're actually doing flo again, but on the other side because you're using the same stitch in 2a as you do in 2b, just the other side of the stitch.

Explanation 3:  
One last explanation. Look at the pictures.

## head

- 1) sc 14 around the u 12
- 2a) turn FLO sc 12 12
- 2b) turn, BLO sc 12 24
- Yup Not Kidding! You're going to sc around, first doing the front loops and then the back loops.
- 3) sc 24
- 4) [inc, sc 5],x4 28
- 5) [dec, 12] x 2 26
- 6-8) sc 26 26
- 9) blo sc 26 26
- 10) sc 26 26
- 11) dec x13, 13
- fo tuck inside head



## body

- 1) sc 6 in mc 6
- 2) inc 12
- 3) [sc 1, inc] x 6 18
- 4) [sc 2, inc] x 6 24
- 5) [sc 3, inc] x 6 30
- 6) sc 30 30
- 7) blo sc 30 30
- 8-15) sc 30 30 (8 rounds)
- 16) blo sc 30 30
- 17) sc 30 30
- 18) [sc 3, dec] x 6 24
- Stuff a little. It doesn't need much.
- 19) dec continuously until closed.

# Frog Universe

Puff: (yo, go into space, yo, pull back through) x3

## arms make 2

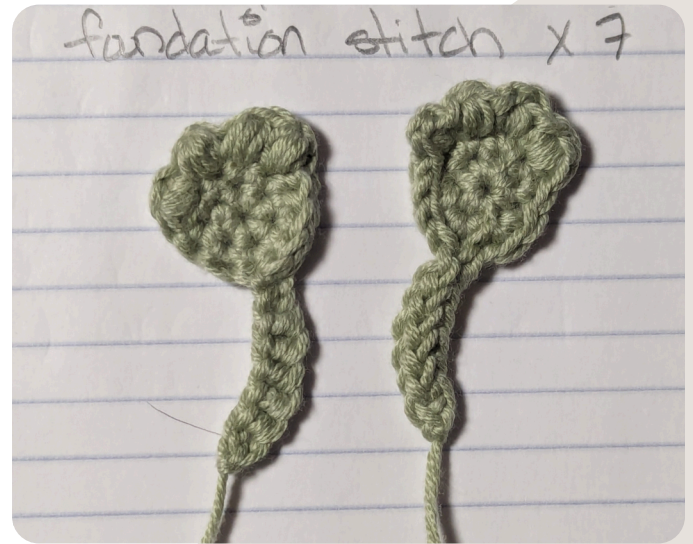
- 1) 6 sc in mc 6
- 2) slst x 2, alt-puff x3, slst to center of bottom of foot, foundation stitch x5

## legs make 2

- 1) 6 sc in mc 6
- 2) inc 12
- 3) slst x 4, alt-puff x4, slst to center of bottom of foot, foundation stitch x7

## tongue

ch 13 second ch from hook, 3dc, hdc, sc 10 fo  
That's chain 3, 3 dc in the same space, half double crochet, single crochet 10, fasten off.  
Remember if the number comes first, you do that many in the same space.



# Frog Universe

## Assembly

I sew about a third of the head to the body

Sew the tongue inside the body.

Sew arms about a rounds down from the top of the body, on either side. I usually stick a pin through the body to make sure they're even, but honestly uneven is cute.

The legs, sit the body of a flat surface, make a note of where the body touches the surface and sew the legs right in front at the bottom of the body. If you sew the legs under the body, it tips over.
