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## Granny Square Chicken Hand Warmer Crochet Pattern

We're starting with a standard sunflower granny square, but you can use whatever type of roundish flower style square you like, just make sure it's square and it doesn't have a lot of gaps.


## Make 2.

Ch 5 and make a loop

- 1. In the loop, ch 2, dc 15, join & fo. (16 because ch 2 = 1 dc)
- 2. Change color. Ch 2 & puff in ss (puff, ch 1) x15 join & fo. (16 puffs)
- 3. Change color. Ch 2 & bobble in ss, ch 2. (bobble ch 2) x15 (16 bobbles) join & fo.
- 4. Change color. Ch 2 dc 2 in ss ([3 tc ch 2 3 tc] ss, 3 dc, 3 hdc, 3 dc) x3, [3 tc ch 2 3 tc] ss, 3 dc, 3 hdc join & fo.



Place wrong sides together and sew 3 of the sides together leaving 1 side open. Meaning you should be able to see the pretty sides on both sides.



With the open end on the right, go to the left corner and count toward the right 8 spaces. Starting in the 8th sp from the left: Ch 1 & sc in ss, 3 dc in ss, sc, dc & tc ss, tc & dc ss, sc, 3 dc ss, sc, sl st fo

Beak - Yellow Yarn: sc, dc & ch 3 & dc ss, sc, sl st fo.

Yarn: Loops & Threads Blush Rainbow Hook: 2.75mm or 3mm


- \* Add eyes
- \* Stuff a toddler sock with a little rice. When microwaved for 30 seconds to a minute, the rice warms for a warmer. Or stuff with fiber for non-hand warmer.

NOTE: If you're making hand warmers, know that plastic eyes may become hot when microwaved. You may want to use different eyes when making hand warmers.

Fold bottom half flat and sew across the bottom making a triangle of sorts.

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Weave all ends.



Bobble: 5 partial dcs. So (y/o, insert hook, y/o and pull through loop, y/o and pull through 2 loops) x5, y/o, pull through all 6 loops.

NOTE: Every round you fo.

Every round join new color with slst in any space

You work in the spaces.

NOTE: You make puffs in the top of the dcs from the round below.

You make bobbles in the ch 1 space from the round below.

In the 4th round, you make the stitch combination in the ch 2 space from the previous round.

NOTE: the first ch2 of the round counts as a dc.

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
