

# Share Anywhere Free Pattern

## Fidget Thumb Twiddler Crochet Pattern

**Hook:** 2.75mm

**Yarn:** Big Twist - Baby Bunny - Super Fine 1

**Stitch:** Tunisian

**NOTE:** The number of ch in the foundation ch stay the same for each size, the row count changes.

ch = chain

fo = fasten off

fp Forward Pass

rp = Return Pass

st = stitch

tss = Tunisian single stitch

Each row has a fp and a rp

(fp): Tss each vertical bar across.

(rp): Along the horizontal across the top.

**Medium** (Teens and Most Adults)

ch 10

Row 1. Starting in the second ch from hook, using the back bump, pick up 9 sts (10 loops on hook), ch 1, rp

Row 2. tss x10 (10 loops on hook), ch 1, rp

Repeat Row 2 x18 (total of 19 rows)

final pass - but do **NOT** cut

**TURN** - Yes, I know it's odd, but stick with me.

Row A. In the back of the fo, draw up 9 sts (10 loops on hook), ch 1, rp

Row B. tss x10 (10 loops on hook), ch 1, rp

Repeat Row B x18 (total of 19 rows)

fo - leave long tail for sewing.

Fold project into a figure 8 and lay flat with the tss on outside.

Sew through each later across the project.

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**Small** (Child Thumbs)

Follow the pattern for Medium with one exception, the number of rows.

Repeat Row 2 x16 (total of 17 rows)

Repeat Row B x16 (total of 17 rows)

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**Large** (Man Hands)

Follow the pattern for Medium with one exception, the number of rows.

Repeat Row 2 x27 (total of 28 rows)

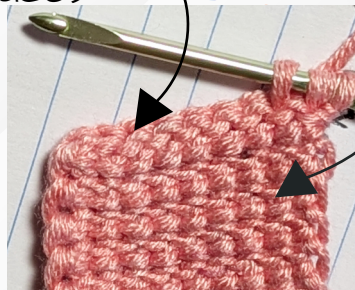
Repeat Row B x27 (total of 28 rows)

PS. I have no idea how to write a pattern for Tunisian Crochet and can't find a example. Sorry.

normal 2.75 hook



pull up a loop from each of the 10 spaces



backside

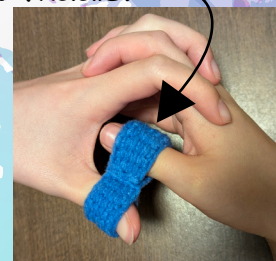
an equal number of rows on each end.



fold into figure 8 and sew through all 3 layers across. fo, weave ends.
